Profile

In addition, Adam has successfully defended employers against employment discrimination and retaliation claims in the New York State Division of Human Rights and Equal Employment Opportunity Commission. He has obtained findings of "No Probable Cause" from these administrative agencies dismissing complaints in many matters, including for clients in the healthcare industry, technology industry, manufacturing industry, and banking industry.
