	Mandatory	Recommended Best Practices
Physical Distancing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Ensure that workforce (e.g. salespeople, workers, subcontractors, and vendors) and customer presence total occupancy is limited to 50% of the maximum occupancy for a particular area as set by the certificate of occupancy. ✓ A distance of at least 6 ft. must be maintained amongst all individuals at all times, unless safety of the core activity requires a shorter distance (e.g. cleaning, maintenance, measurement for appraisals, unit inspections). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Remind residents and customers to wear face coverings in shared spaces (e.g. lobby corridors, elevators, apartment units) when a minimum 6 ft. is not possible. ✓ Restrict/modify the number of workstations and worker seating areas, so that workers are at least six feet apart in all directions (e.g. side-to-side and when facing one another) and are not sharing workstations without cleaning and disinfection between use. ✓ Enable the use of stairs to prevent congregation in elevator waiting areas and limit density in elevators.

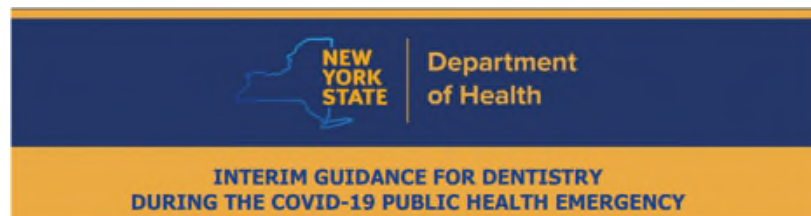

- Phase Three will be the real test.
- Executive Order 202.36:
 - Any region that meets the prescribed public health and safety metrics as determined by the Department of Health for Phase One reopening may allow outdoor, low-risk recreational activities and businesses providing such activities, as determined by Empire State Development Corporation, to be permitted to operate, in accordance with Department of Health guidance.
